* For the first 3 months after adoption, the adopter is entitled to free behavioural advice from shelter behaviourists. They take place by phone or by appointment **at the hostel**.

INFORMATION CLAUSE ON PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

- 1. The administrator of your personal data is the Shelter on Paluch named after Jan Lityński with its registered office in Warsaw (02-147), at ul. Paluch 2.
- 2. The administrator has appointed the Data Protection Supervisor at the Shelter on Paluch named after Jan Lityński who can be contacted by e-mail: iod@napaluchu.waw.pl or by writing to the address of the Administrator's office.
- 3. Personal data made available to the Administrator will be processed in accordance with the Regulation of the European Parliament and Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and the repeal of Directive 95/46 (general data protection regulation GDPR), art. 6 para. 1 b) the processing is necessary for the performance of the contract to which the subject of the data is party or take action at the request of the subject of data prior to the conclusion of the contract.
- 4. Your personal data will be processed in order to conclude a contract or to take action before its conclusion, which will allow adoption of the animal.
- 5. In connection with the processing of data for the purposes referred to in point 4, the recipient of your personal data will be: employees of the Capital City of Warsaw Office, employees of the City Guard of the Capital City of Warsaw, Geulincx Poland Sp. z o.o, International Database SAFE-ANIMAL.
- 6. Your personal data will be kept for the duration of the adoption agreement and then for an obligatory period regarding the storage of documents, governed by separate provisions. In the event that the contract is not concluded, the data will be stored for 24 months.
- 7. In connection with the processing of personal data, you have the right to access your data, to rectify it, delete it, limit processing, the right to object to the processing, as well as the right to transfer data.
- 8. If you have been informed of unlawful processing of your personal data, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for the Protection of Personal Data.
- 9. Providing your personal data by yourself is voluntary, but it is a condition of concluding a contract or taking action before its conclusion, and not providing the data will make it impossible to conclude a contract.
